## THE INQUISITION AGAINST GOYA

**“Luis Zueco is the Spanish Ken Follett” Cadena SER**

In 1799, Francisco de Goya published *Los Caprichos*, a collection of 80 extraordinary prints that denounce the flaws of Spanish society and defend Enlightenment ideals. Just fourteen days after its release, the artist withdrew the work from circulation, raising the question: what was he afraid of? Goya was a highly respected figure, close to kings and ministers, yet he chose to risk everything for his convictions, challenging power and the Old Regime at a time of great unrest.


Opposing him stood the Inquisition —an institution in decline, but still feared, capable of destroying lives— and Goya’s work posed a real threat to the regime, especially if it reached Napoleonic France, where revolution had already toppled a monarchy. The danger was real, and Goya knew it.

Through Angélica, a young art lover new to Madrid, we witness Goya’s courage, the vibrant cultural scene of the time, and a fight for freedom in the face of tyranny. This is not just the story of a genius —it’s a powerful tale of how art can challenge power and ignite change.



## LUIS ZUECO

Luis Zueco is a novelist, historian, researcher and photographer. At present he is Managing Director of the Castillo de Grisel, a medieval castle turned into a hotel. His novel *The 33rd Step* obtained the honourable mention at the International Award for Historical Novel of Zaragoza in 2012. It also obtained the award for the **best historical thriller in the Historical Novel Festival of Úbeda**. He has achieved international success with his fascinating Medieval Trilogy: *The Castle*, *The City* and *The Monastery*, three novels set in the most important architectural settings of medieval times. He is one of the most important historical novelists in Spanish with more than **500.000 copies sold and his books have been translated into Polish, Portuguese and Italian**.

## SANDRA SEGURA

Sandra Segura (1965), originally from Las Palmas de Gran Canaria, has lived in Valencia for more than thirty years, where she studied Administration and Accounting. The daughter of Spanish immigrants, she grew up surrounded by stories of travel, adventure and life changes that her parents and grandparents shared in their daily lives. These family stories, full of nostalgia, discoveries and longings, became the seed of her literary inspiration. With them, Sandra shaped her first novel, *Where the Sea Takes Us*, a work in which she mixes memories, emotions and the magic of stories passed down from generation to generation, transporting the reader to worlds full of evocation and sensitivity.



# THE LAST CONCERT IN VIENNA

MUSIC BECOMES A STAGE FOR SECRETS, LOYALTY AND SURVIVAL

Vienna, late 1944. Caught between two fronts, the Third Reich has launched a counterattack that will decide the outcome of World War II. While preparing for the New Year's Concert, conductor Clemens Krauss receives a visit from an enigmatic SS captain who seems determined to find out what his relationship is with alleged traitors to the Nazi regime.

Although Krauss and his partner, the singer Viorica Ursuleac, are two of Adolf Hitler's favourite artists, the conductor will be forced to confront a past full of dark secrets, doubts about his loyalty to the Reich and a revelation that could jeopardise the most famous concert in the world. A concert that was born, precisely, at the height of Nazism.


With great documentary work and faithful to his literary style, Martín Llade, the classical music journalist who presents the New Year's Concert, takes us on a journey to the heart of the famous gala in Vienna.



## MARTÍN LLADE

Martín Llade was born in San Sebastián in 1976. He holds a degree in Journalism and Advertising from the University of the Basque Country. In 2007, he joined Radio Clásica de RTVE, where he has been presenting the programme *Sinfonía de la mañana* since 2014, for which he received the Ondas Award for best radio programme and presenter in 2016. He also contributes to RNE's *El ojo crítico* and hosts *En clave de 5* on Radio 5.

He is the author of the novel *What I Will Never Know About Teresa* (2021), about cult actress Teresa Ann Savoy, and *The Chimerical Horizon, Delirious Stories from the History of Music* (2022). This was followed by the children's book *The Interrupted Music of María de Pablos*. In 2024, he published *The Razumovski Mystery*, a novel that received the **Hislibris Prize for Historical Fiction**. Considered one of Spain's leading experts on classical music, Llade offers us a new ambitious historical novel, *The last concert in Vienna*.




### SALVADOR FELIP



Ildefonso Falcones is a lawyer and writer. *La catedral del mar* (The Cathedral of the Sea), his first novel, became an **unprecedented global publishing phenomenon**, acclaimed by readers and critics alike and **published in more than forty countries**. It also won several awards, including the 2006 Euskadi de Plata for best novel in Spanish, the **José Manuel Lara Foundation award for best-selling novel** in 2006, the prestigious Italian Giovanni Boccaccio 2007 award, the Città dello Stretto 2008 international award, and the Fulbert de Chartres 2009 award. In 2018, it was turned into a successful Netflix series. His second novel, *La mano de Fátima* (Grijalbo, 2009), won the 2010 Roma Prize, and his next work, *La reina descalza* (Grijalbo, 2013), received the Pencho Cros Prize. *Los herederos de la tierra* (Grijalbo, 2016) was the eagerly awaited sequel to *La catedral del mar* and has also been turned into a series recently released on Netflix. With **more than eleven million copies of his work sold worldwide**, Ildefonso Falcones now returns, almost twenty years after the overwhelming success of *La catedral del mar*, with the third installment of the most widely read saga of our time: *En el amor y en la guerra*.







Madrid, 1977. Iñaki Biggi returns to the genre that established him as a writer with a fast-paced new crime story full of constant intrigue.



## IÑAKI BIGGI

Iñaki Biggi, born in San Sebastián in 1965, holds a degree in Psychology, but his true calling has always been literature, particularly historical fiction—a genre in which he has stood out with works such as *El Santuario* and *La fórmula Stradivarius*. With *Valkirias* (2018), set during a Viking raid in 9th-century Seville, he established himself as one of the most original voices in the field, earning the prestigious Cerros de Úbeda Award for Best Historical Novel of the Year. Throughout his career, Biggi has combined history with thriller elements, crafting plots where intrigue and historical context are seamlessly intertwined. In titles such as *El lobo de Whitechapel*, *Proyecto Moisés*, and the recent *La rosa blanca* (2025), set in Madrid during Spain's democratic transition, the author showcases his versatility in tackling different time periods and literary styles.

In the course of her research, she discovered many other female pirates from different eras and places, most of them largely unknown, and decided to give them a voice and recount their adventures. *Loto rojo* (Red Lotus) is the story of one of them. 

# THE TOMB OF EL GRECO




## BALTASAR MAGRO
